- Results weighted to reflect 50/50 male/female respondents

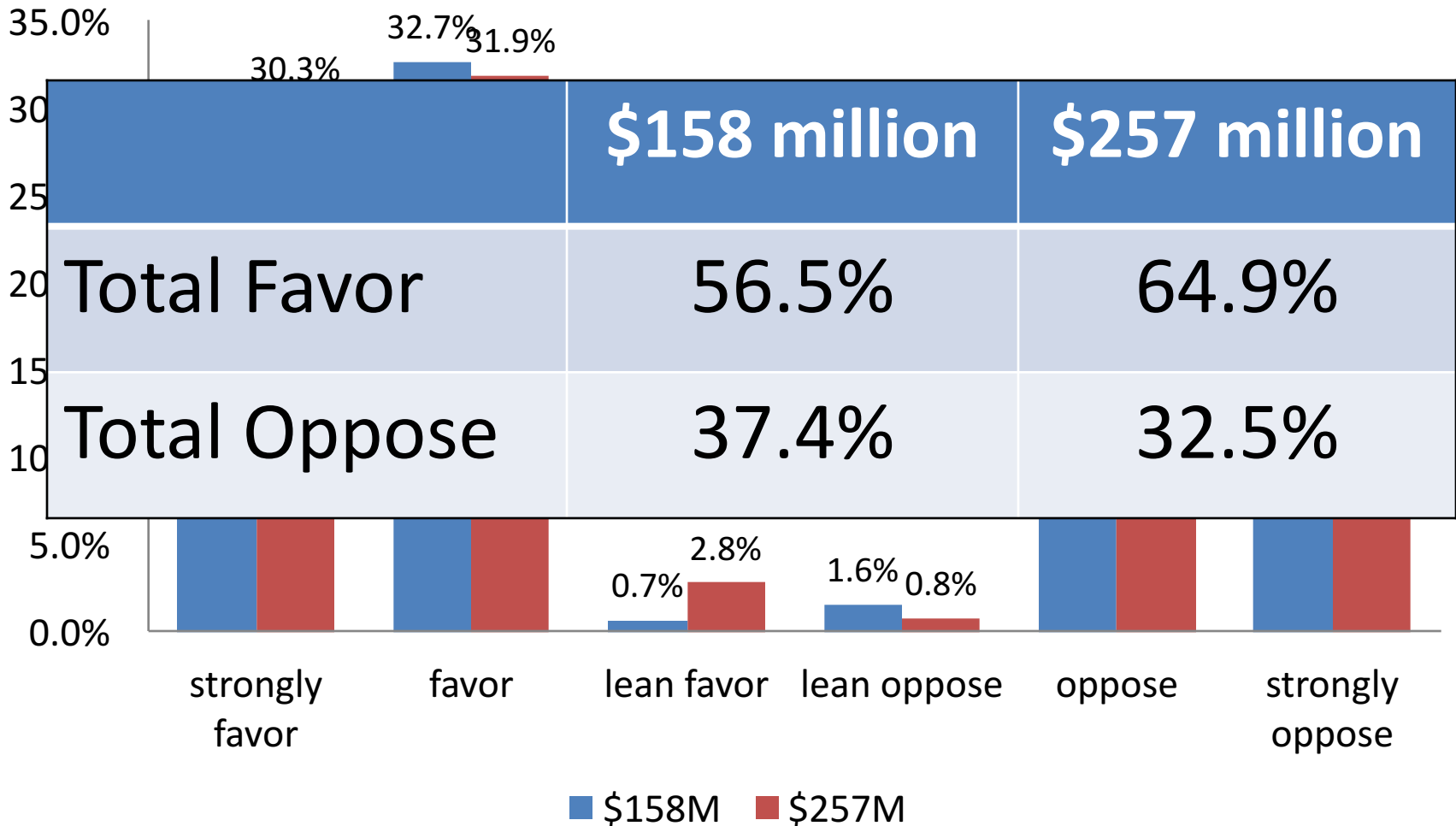
Possible Bond Proposal (\$158M)

Although an exact cost has yet to be determined, for the purpose of this question, let's assume that the proposal would ask voters to approve bonds in the amount of \$158 million to expand and renovate Central and Centennial High Schools in their current locations. If a vote were held today, would you strongly favor, favor, oppose, or strongly oppose such a proposal?

03B. Unit 4 is considering asking voters to approve a bond issue in order to fund facility improvements. Although an exact cost has yet to be determined, for the purpose of this question, let's assume that the proposal would ask voters to approve bonds in the amount of \$257 million to renovate and expand Central and Centennial High Schools, rebuild Dr. Howard Elementary School, renovate or rebuild South Side Elementary School, and renovate and expand International Prep Academy and Edison Middle School. If a vote were held today, would you strongly favor, favor, oppose, or strongly oppose such a proposal?

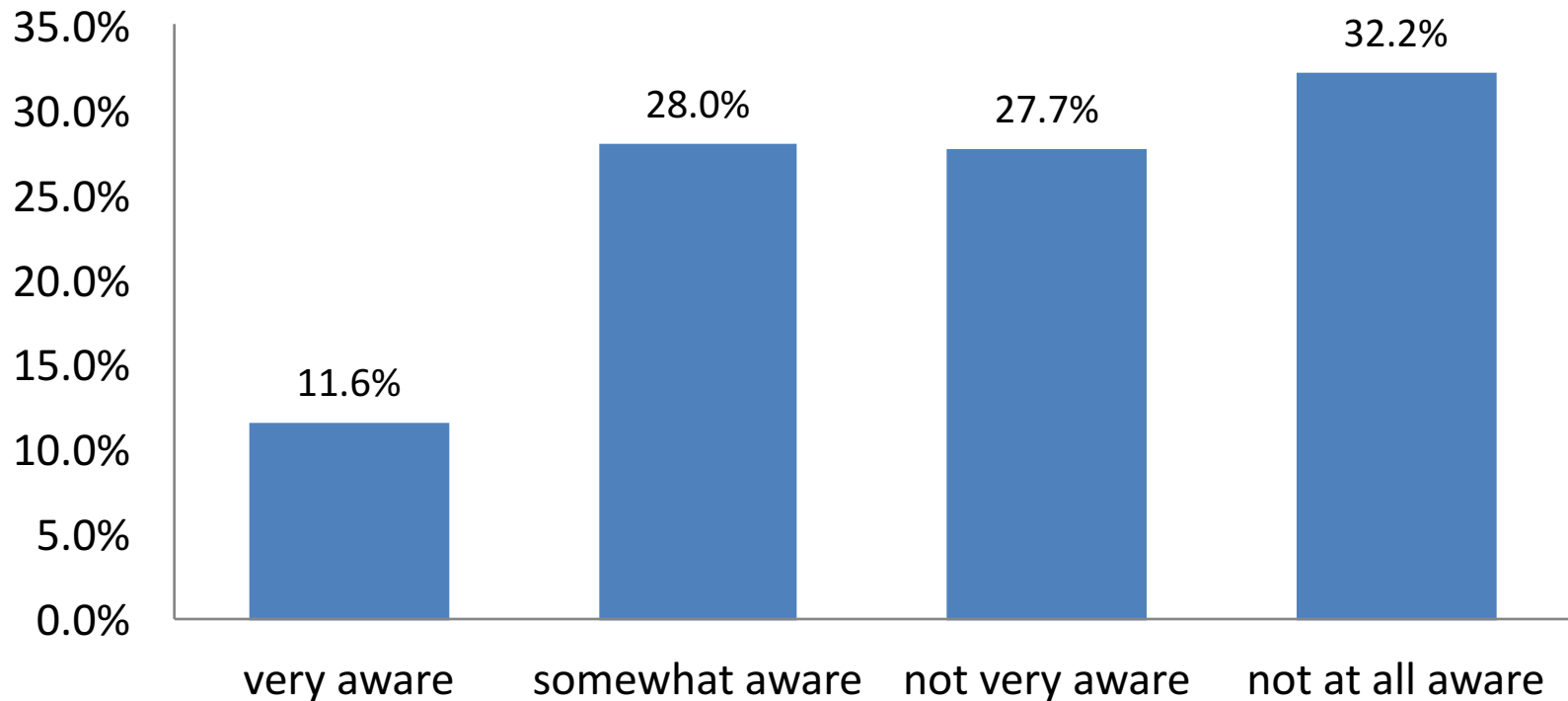

Required Health and Safety Repairs



39. State law requires Unit 4 to make upwards of \$6.5 million for health and safety repairs and renovations to its school buildings. If bond money does not exist however, the Board of Education is obligated by law to determine a tax rate hike to pay for these improvements. 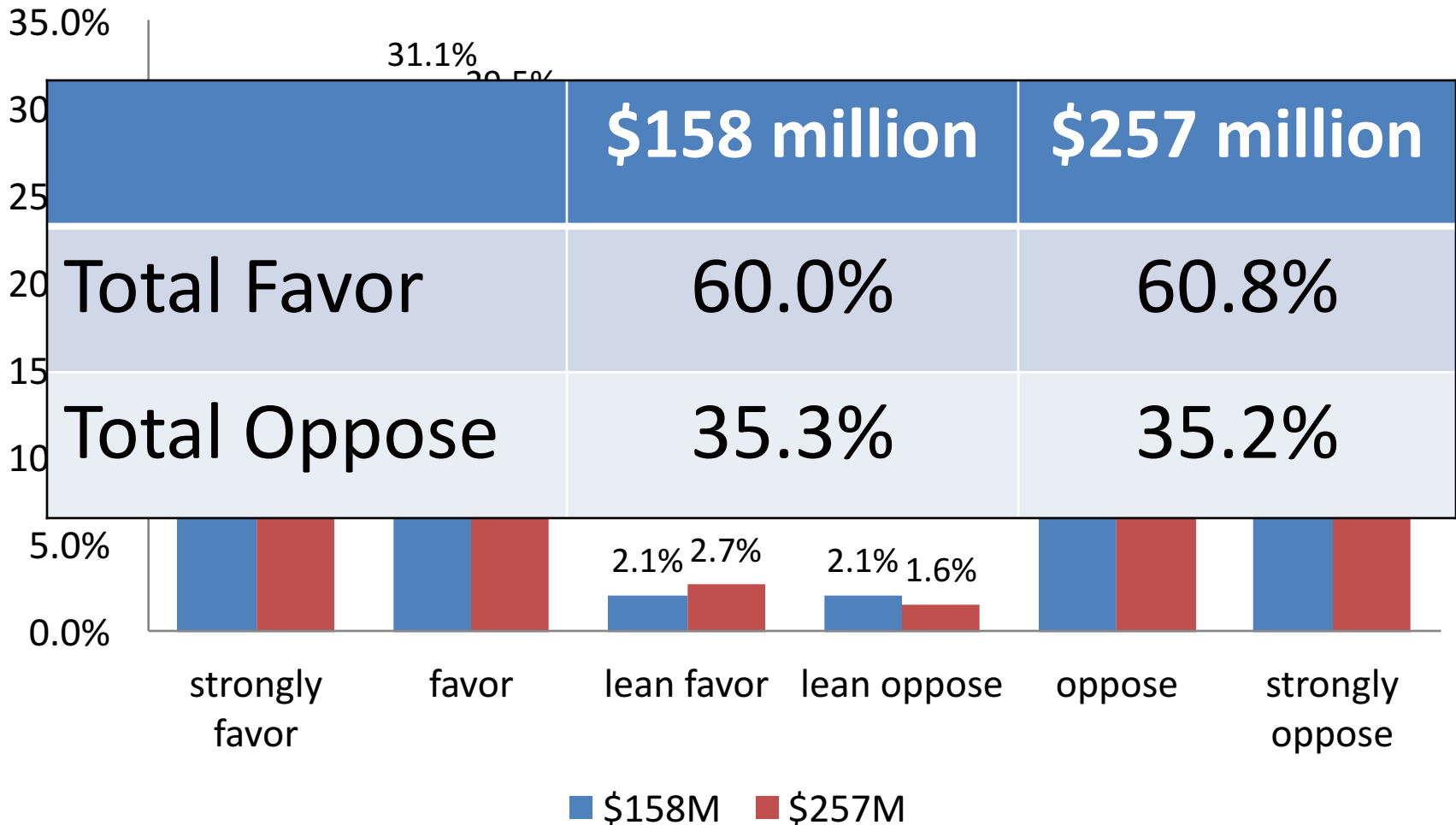
Bond Proposal (\$158M) - Reconsider

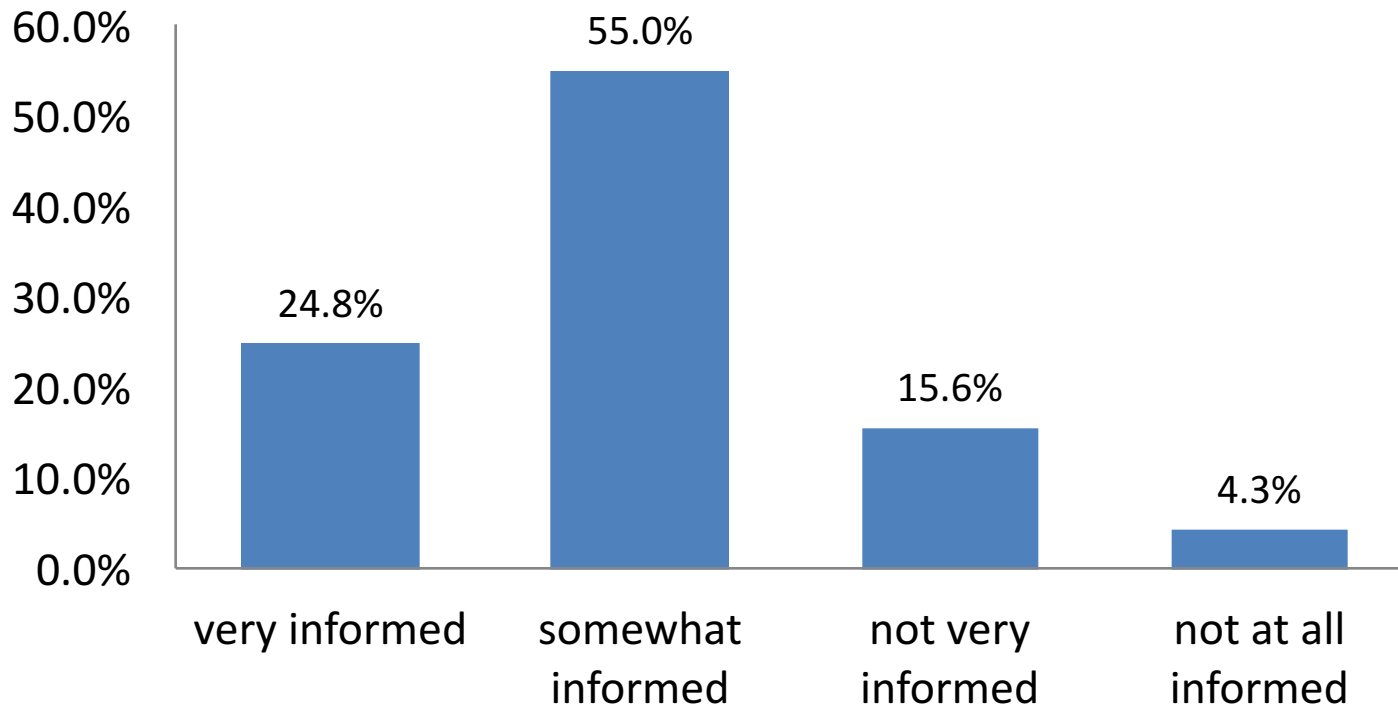
Bond Proposal (\$257M) - Reconsider
